The Florida Commission's CJBAT Exam is a 1.5-hour test consisting of 97 questions, assessing six minimum competencies for law enforcement and correctional officers: Written Comprehension, Written Expression, Memorization, Deductive Reasoning, Inductive Reasoning, and Personal Characteristics/Behavioral Attributes.
