Per the Tennessee Public Records Law, Memphis public records refer to any document created or received by city officials and employees concerning city business - except where restricted by law. Memphis public records may be physical, handwritten documents or may take the form of digital files created on a computer and transmitted electronically. Not all Memphis records are public records, and not all portions of public records are available for public view. By state law, confidential records include (but are not limited to) the following: Medical records of patients in government-run medical facilitiesInvestigative records belonging to local law enforcementAll files belonging to the drivers license issuance division and the handgun carry permit division of the department of safety.Records of students in public institutionsCertain personal information of law enforcement officersOfficial health certificatesInvestigative records and reports of the department of child servicesMemphis Crime StatisticsThe Memphis City Police department collates records of all crimes and arrests that occur in the city and makes those records available to the public. In 2016, the department reported 11,947 violent crimes and 36,988 property crimes. Among Memphis 656,434 residents, the police department reported 24,604 cases of larceny-theft, 9,150 burglaries, 387 arson cases, 186 murders, 534 rapes, and 8,029 cases of aggravated assault. These crime numbers rose over two years. In 2018, the police department reported a total of 12,674 violent crimes and 41,779 property crimes. Reports of larceny-theft were reduced by 8007, while aggravated assaults dropped by 918.Are Memphis Criminal Records Public?Per the Tennessee Public Records Law, Memphis criminal records are public property. Interested parties may request criminal background records from the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation office, the central storehouse for criminal history information in Memphis City and the state. Interested parties may request Memphis police reports in person, by telephone, fax, or by mail. For Tennessee residents who present ID, the cost of a police report is 15 cents per page. Non-residents must pay \$15 per report, while reports requested by fax or email cost \$15. The Central Records Division is open from Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.CENTRAL RECORDS170 North Main St.7th Floor, Suite 7-11Memphis, TN 38103How to Find Sex Offender Information in MemphisThe Tennessee Bureau of Investigation maintains a record of all convicted sex offenders in Memphis City and the state. These records are available on the Tennessee Sex Offender Registry. Interested public members can view Memphis sex offenders details, such as names, aliases, images, and physical descriptors. The site also allows interested persons to sign up for email notifications when new sex offenders come into the neighborhood and accept public information to find sex offenders who violate the terms of their release.How to Find Memphis Inmate RecordsConvicted offenders in Memphis City serve time in the Shelby County Jail. Individuals interested in obtaining Memphis inmate records may query the Shelby County Sheriff's online database. The database contains details of all persons currently incarcerated in Shelby County Jail, and users can search by name, date of birth, or booking number.How Do I Visit an inmate in Memphis Jail?Every individual interested in visiting an inmate at Shelby County Jail must fill out this visitor application form and provide a valid email address. The approved visitation schedule is available online. Inmates may receive a maximum of two adult and three child visitors during a given time. Visitors may only see one inmate per visitation - unless the other inmate is a blood relative. All adult visitors must present one of the following forms of identification:Drivers licenseState-Issued Photo IDPassportMilitary IDAdults must accompany any minors and are responsible for keeping them in order and within the specified visitation area. Visitors will be allowed an opportunity for a brief embrace or kiss at the beginning or end of the visit. At other times, prison staff will not permit:Visitors or inmates leaning or lying across one another.Cuddling, massaging, or fondlingExposing sensitive body partsUsing hostile or vulgar languageDisrupting other visitors experiencesSitting on another persons legs.Visitors are encouraged to dress comfortably in clothes that fit. Visitors may not wear skimpy or torn clothes that do not cover sensitive body parts. Visitors are only allowed to wear one ring, one watch, and a small pair of earrings.Court RecordsMemphis City is a part of Shelby County. The Shelby County General Sessions Court Clerks Office provides the public with various Memphis court records like civil records and criminal records. However, the law prevents the public from accessing confidential documents. Interested parties may search for civil and criminal case records by case number. Most Memphis vital records are publicly available. Interested requesters can obtain vital records by applying to the custodian agency.Where and How to Obtain Memphis Divorce RecordsIn Memphis City, the Shelby County Circuit Court and the Chancery Court grant divorce decrees and make certified copies available to the public. Interested individuals that wish to obtain certified copies of divorce decrees must visit the Shelby County Courthouse. To find a copy of the desired record, requesters must provide as many details as possible, including:The divorcees namesThe case ID or numberThe divorce dateThe divorce location: Circuit or Chancery courtThe cost of certified copies of Memphis divorce records is \$5, plus 50 cents per page. Interested individuals may obtain certified copies of birth certificates online, or from the Vital Records office in person. To apply, interested persons must fill out this birth certificate application form and pay a \$15 fee. To apply, interested persons must fill out this death certificate application form and pay a \$15 fee. City residents may request any government bodys records as long as they are not under legal seal. As most records in the city are public property, Memphis City has a high transparency rate. However, if an interested party runs into challenges when looking for Memphis City public records, StateRecords.org is a third-party website that provides alternative search tools. The information available in this application pertains to Tennessee felony offenders who are or who have been in the custody of the Tennessee Department of Correction. The information is submitted by various jurisdictions within Tennessee. Confirmation and/or elaboration should be obtained from the originating jurisdiction. Information, such as an individuals current status, location, photo, and active sentences, is available to citizens free of charge. Search Now Official statewide background checks are available from the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (fees apply).
