Give the auto search method a shot: 1. Turn on your Roku device. 2. Press and hold the Setup button on your remote until the indicator light starts blinking. 3. Enter 9-9-2. 4. The light should blink twice. 5. Aim the remote at your Roku device and press the Power button. Keep in mind that these methods might take some trial and error, but with a little patience, you'll get it sorted out! Using the Power button as the remote scans through codes is the key to successfully turning off your Roku device. Release the button when it turns off. If other methods don't work, try using the learning mode feature on your GE universal remote. This lets the remote learn commands directly from your original Roku remote. To do this: place both remotes head-to-head and press and hold the Setup button until the light starts blinking. Enter 9-7-5, and the light should blink twice. Choose a button you want to teach (e.g., Power) and press it on your original Roku remote. The GE remote's light will blink twice when it learns the command. Repeat this for all necessary buttons. Roku devices have different GE universal remote codes. For example: - Streaming devices like Roku Stick or Box need 4355, 7317, 2014, 6001, 6171, 2013, or 0903. - Roku TVs from brands like Hisense, TCL, Philips, and others require CL3 Codes: * New models use 2891, 1741 * Models after 2013 need 4395, 4355 * Older models (2011-2012) use 7317 * Mixed codes for new models are 6171, 6251, 6001, 6381, 2891, 1741, 5931. For quick setup on your GE Universal Remote with your Roku device: turn it on and press the "Setup" button until the light blinks twice. Enter a remote code from the list above and test if it works by trying to control your Roku device. If not, try another code and repeat the process. Continue this process until the TV turns itself off. Once you've completed either of these methods, try using functions like volume and channel change to test your GE universal remote. If you're still having trouble finding the code for your specific device or brand, provide the name of your TV brand, and we'll do our best to find it for you.
