They include: - S'occuper de: To take care of - Se vanter: To boast or talk about something proudly - Pousser: To push or encourage someone to do something - Rappeler: To recall or remember something - Harceler: To harass or annoy someone - Sortir: To exit or leave a place - Remettre à plus tard: To put off until later - Dégouter: To disgust or make someone lose interest - Eteindre: To extinguish or turn off - Rendre: To return or give something back - Exclure: To exclude or rule out something - Renverser: To overturn or reverse something - Effrayer: To scare or frighten someone - Fuir: To flee or run away from something - Arriver: To arrive or come to a place - S'asseoir: To sit down and take a seat - Trimer: To work hard or slave away at something - Passer la nuit: To spend the night somewhere - Éclipser: To slip away or escape unnoticed - Régler: To settle or resolve something - Prévenir: To prevent or warn someone about something - Avertir: To alert or notify someone of something important - Se renverser: To overturn or turn over, often used to describe a sudden change in situation. - Mettre à la porte: To dismiss or fire someone from their job. - Rendre compte: To account for or explain something. - Prévenir: To prevent or warn someone about something.
