RetroArch is a cross-platform tool that manages emulators, game engines, and other programs. This article shows you how to install Steam RetroArch cores. ****Step 1: Get The Latest Cores**** * Navigate to this link and expand the folder if necessary. * Choose the most recent stable version (currently 1.10.1) for your operating system. ****Step 2: Download And Install Cores**** * From the directory you clicked, download RetroArch cores in a 7z file. * Extract them using 7-zip or another extractor to a convenient location like your Downloads folder. * Navigate to the extracted folder and copy all files to "RetroArch-Win64 (or your architecture) > cores". ****Step 3: Paste The Cores**** * Locate the RetroArch folder in Steam by right-clicking it, selecting properties, then Local Files and Browse. * Open the cores folder within this location and paste the copied files. ****Important Note****: Don't use DLC to overwrite RetroArch's cores as they will update via Steam before launch. You'll need the explorer window, which should be in your RetroArch info folder, and paste its contents into the single text field provided in this guide. Please note that those symbols are backslashes, not Yen indicators, due to my Japanese Locale setting. Thanks, Microsoft. ****Adding Cores to Steam RetroArch**** I only wish they had included the online updater like in the standalone version. However, you can still accrue Steam playtime by modifying the start parameters as follows: For Windows: "C:\Path\To\RetroArch" %command% For Linux: "/path/to/retroarch" && %command% This enables you to play your standalone version while earning Steam credits and using the overlay normally. ****About Me**** I'm an avid music listener from various countries, and writing is my passion. This guide will show you how to add more Cores to the Steam version of RetroArch, which doesn't have an online updater. ****Guide: Adding Cores**** Since the Cores for this version are released as DLCs, you can download them from the official source and copy them into a folder. However, I haven't extensively tested every Core in the Steam version (except PPSSPP), so if some don't work as intended, it's not my fault! To add Cores: 1. Go to the Official buildbot RetroArch site and download the Cores. 2. Extract the zip file using a tool like 7z. 3. Copy the desired Cores from the extracted folder to your Steam installation folder (e.g., C:\Program Files (x86)\Steam\steamapps\common\RetroArch). 4. Paste the copied Cores into the "cores" folder within the RetroArch installation. You're done! Now you have the Cores from the standalone version of RetroArch. RetroArch is a frontend for emulators and other tools, eliminating the need for multiple emulators across devices. It runs on various platforms, including Windows 98, and supports a wide range of consoles and handheld devices. RetroArch uses "cores," which are essentially emulators without user interfaces, allowing developers to push updates directly through the RetroArch framework. Adding Cores to RetroArch is relatively easy, with the simplest option being to do it within the program itself. just launch retroarch with a mouse and keyboard, it's pretty straightforward. First, if you've been away from retroarch for a bit, get the latest updates using the online updater. this'll grab any new cores or cheat tables that have been added since your last visit. navigate to the core downloader in the updater or load core menu, where you'll find a massive list of consoles and their respective cores. each core has its own backstory, dev history, and features - for example, flycast for dreamcast might have different support compared to other emus. the main diff between retroarch and that unofficial ps4 version is that you get to choose what to install rather than everything at once. the user interface is pretty much the same across all platforms, so just apply this to your chosen console. don't expect miracles, though - the only thing holding you back from playing ps2 games on your 3ds is the hardware itself.
